Welcome!

Welcome freshmen and new members to CSF and Honor Roll Club. This semester we have over 350 members! We have a lot of exciting things going on to live up to our motto, "Scholarship for Service." It is up to all of you to keep informed about activities through newsletters, the video bulletins, posted bulletins in every class, our website (www.whscsf.org), schoolloop (you need to check daily!) posters around campus, and our own glass display case to the right of the library. Recap of General Meeting

To remain active, all members must earn 5 fundraising and 5 community service points in a semester. All points are due May 5th, no exceptions. To go on the San Francisco Honor trip on May 20th, you must have 10 fundraising and 10 community service points. We handed out a sheet summarizing the benefits of belonging to CSF and Honor Roll Club and a community service form. If you did not attend the meeting, stop by room 28 to get these forms.

Fundraising this Semester:

* Fresh Choice on March 10th, 11th, 12th. (See attached flyer.) Each person (over 5 years old) counts as 1 point. You must leave flyers at the cash register filled in properly and with a receipt attached. We will have more Fresh Choice nights on April 28th, 29th and 30th.

* Candy sale this semester is March 24th-28th. You must pre-pay for each bag of 10 which sells for \$7.50 (75 cents each) and counts as 1 point per bag. You may only pick up one bag per day during tutorial or after school only.

* Westmont mugs will be on sale for \$7 in 2 weeks, which equals 1 point.

* Get your fundraising points EARLY so you don't panic at the end.

Community Service

* One hour of volunteering in the community or at school is 1 point.

* Check out our 1st Community Service Fair on Feb. 28th at lunch for ideas.

* You may not do anything religious (like working at church) or related to your family (like tutoring your brother).

* An adult must supervise all activities.

* NO double dipping, i.e., you cannot count our hours also for Key Club, Honors English, Scouts, etc.

* Turn in forms to room 53 when you finish them. Don't wait until the last minute to get them signed! All forms are due by May 5th. No exceptions!

* Current activities include:

- Helping the Ecology Club collect recyclables on Thursday.

- Serving meals at the Emergency Housing Consortium.

- Westmont Beautification Day in April. Time: TBA.

- Check bulletin board in room 53 and glass case by the library.

- You may work at a library, hospital, elementary school, help a Westmont teacher, etc. If you are not sure if your activity counts, see Mrs. Walton in room 53 before you start!

Seniors

Each senior must meet individually with Mrs. Heinrichsen in room 28 to talk about potential awards for graduation and to sign a contract. This can be done from March

10th to the 28th during tutorial if Mrs. H is not busy tutoring students or after school is preferable. If you do not come in, awards will **not** be ordered for you.

Academic Code of Conduct

Any member breaking the code will lose their membership for this semester. Breaking the code two times in high school results in a permanent loss of membership. Any seniors violating the code will **not** get any awards at graduation.

San Francisco Honor Trip
